As with all Family Action Agents teaching videos, learning and fun are our top priorities!

You have just purchased an excellent TOOL in helping your kids learn from the Word of God! Make sure you go over the video a few times to be sure you are aware of how it is presented and to be comfortable in its presentation. In other words, you want to have a sense of command and excitement that beams out of you while this experience is happening! (Remember a tool does not take the place of you as a leader! It is there to enhance the gifting of talents God has given to you in instructing your kids!)

The best advice we can give is to think of yourself as a TV game show host! You will not just be playing a video and sitting back waiting for your kids to respond, but will be right there with them in the moment and excitement that transpires.

Before you start the video, make 2 teams (example girls vs. boys) and pick two kids (one from each team) to come on stage. Then, go over the instructions on how to play the game. Let the kids know that you will read the questions a couple of times and when the 5 second countdown comes up they can buzz in at any time. Buzzing in could be as simple as them raising a hand, or actually using a buzzer. (See [AMAZON.COM](https://www.amazon.com) and type in "answer buzzers".)

Whoever is first will give a TRUE or FALSE ANSWER. When the correct answer is revealed, if they are correct, they will win 1000 points for their side. If the 6 second TRAPS come up, both must run to their teams to pick another contestant before the game starts to continue.

At the end of the game the group that has the most points, wins!

Remember to KNOCK IT OUT OF THE BALL PARK with this video game and your kids will be telling everyone about the experience as well as asking you when can they play again!
